This guide covers FTP in Mac OS 10.x. Reindl maintains our FTP site to allow users to securely upload and download files to our server in their own dedicated folders. Please contact your Account or Customer Service Representative at **800.236.9637** if you have not been set up or if you have forgotten your username and/or password.

While Panther (OS 10.3), Tiger (OS 10.4), and Leopard (OS 10.5) have built-in FTP capabilities through the Finder, they aren't designed for uploading files. Some 3rd party solutions available are:

1. We highly recommend compressing the folder/files into a single file using software such as Stuffit or Stuffit Deluxe. This compression utility can be found at <http://www.stuffit.com/>. Note that this step is optional but compressing the files will shorten upload times.
2. Open your FTP application and use 71.13.165.154 as the host (IP address).
3. Enter your user name and password in the application before connecting.
4. Connect to the FTP site.
5. Navigate to the Uploads folder if you are uploading files or the Downloads folder if downloading.
6. Begin transferring selected files when the source folder and destination folder are correct. (Please reference your application's manual for specific instructions on beginning the file transfer.)
